CAMP ELIGIBILITY

College for Kids (CFK) is open to kids who will enter grades 2 - 8 in the fall.

DATES and TUITION + \$10 Registration Fee *after June 7*

CFK: Monday through Friday: July 8-12, July 15-19 and July 22-26

Times: See individual schedules for course times.

Tuition per course is \$35, except for the following:

- Babysitting Basics \$47 (\$35 + \$12 book)
- Percy Jackson Explosion Camp \$70 (2 class periods)
- Writer's Workshop \$70 (2 class periods)

REFUND POLICY

Cancellations and requests for refunds must be received 7 days prior to the start of each class session. Students dismissed from the program due to disruptive behavior will not be eligible for a refund.

SCHOLARSHIPS

A limited number of \$110 scholarships will be awarded to children on a first-come, first-served basis who meet the income guidelines for the Federal Free or Reduced Lunch Program. To apply, copy of household 2019 income tax returns (p.1) must accompany the registration and application forms. Only one scholarship per family will be awarded, but families may split the scholarship between siblings.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR REGISTRATION

One *Registration Form* and one *Application* must be submitted **for each child** along with full payment. The \$10 Registration fee is waived for applications received before June 8. The *Schedule* is your guide for selecting courses. It tells which courses are offered each week and at what time through the day.

Students staying through the lunch hour should bring their lunch in insulated containers; no microwave or refrigerator is available.

Once courses have been selected from the *Schedule*, write them on the *Registration Form*. Double-check your courses to make sure they are offered in the timeframe that you have selected and to make sure the grade level is appropriate for your child.

Courses are filled on a first-come, first-served basis, **so please include a second course choice** in the event that your preferred class is not available.

Students will receive their schedule of classes in the last week of June. If you need or want to make changes to your schedule, please contact us and we will do our best to accommodate changes.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

American Girls and Boys Cooking Party: (Grades 4-8)

Ever wanted to go back in time? Now you can while making awesome treats! You will learn recipes from the Colonial times, the age of Pioneers, the Victorian era, and World War II. You also get to do time period games and crafts while cooking. Come join us to become an American Girl party planner!

Androids and Aliens: (Grades 4-8)

Have you ever wanted to meet an alien? In this activity packed class, attend an alien dinner party, design your own robot, and travel through time. Learn about the world of steampunk and create your own "steam" engine. Get a closer to a galaxy far, far away.

Animal Art: (Grades 2-3 and 4-8)

Create a new piece of art each day: a collage rabbit, fish sculpture, lizard tessellation, paint and chalk raccoon and elephant mask. Work with exciting textures, colors and media to create your animal masterpieces.

Babysitting Basics: (Grades 4-8) Requires \$12 Book

Taking care of children is a big job: be prepared! You will learn how to start your own babysitting business. In addition to parent checklists, business cards and basic first aid, students walk away with a bag full of tricks to help kids cope with separation anxiety, bedtime, and emergencies. Be the best babysitter!!

Born to Move: (Grades 2-3)

Do you like to move and have fun? Then Born to Move is for you. We will "work out" while improving coordination, increasing flexibility, and building endurance. Enjoy the fun-filled Kidz Bop Dance and Exercise. Moves are adapted so that everyone is comfortable and able to perform. Come on, let's get physical.

Camp Demigod: (Grades 2-3 and 4-8)

Discover the heroes and villains of Greek Mythology. Participate in reader's theater, play time appropriate games and create your own mythological creature. This class focuses on concepts such as critical thinking, creative expression and teamwork.

Candy Science: (Grades 4-8)

Has your science teacher ever let you eat your lab? Now you can. Learn about natural selection using M&M's, learn to give scientific names to organisms using Jelly Belly jelly beans, and make a model of the cell using all kinds of interesting candy. You will conduct experiment after exciting experiment using candy and then, you get to eat the lab. Science never tasted so good!



Coding: (Grades 4-8)

Create your own computer games, write stories, build in minecraft, and produce original artwork and applications using code.org. Technology is everywhere, learn how to create original work using it.

Cool Crafty Kids: (Grades 2-3)

Enjoy nature and learning different ways to express yourself through hands-on crafting activities. In both indoor and outdoor settings, we will make stained glass mosaics, water color paintings, clay sculptures and draw inspirational quotes/drawing on campus sidewalks. Come join the fun.

CSI: (Grades 2-3 and 4-8)

Get a feel for detective work in this hands-on class as you look for clues and use scientific skills. You will also have the opportunity to practice in the Law Enforcement Academy's simulator and hear from a local detective.

I Survived! (Grades 2-3)

Learn about the destruction of Pompeii, the sinking of the Titanic, Hurricane Katrina and the tornado in Joplin, Mo. through nonfiction readings and fictional retellings. Read the different stories of the survivors and what scientists have learned from these disaster. Then see if you can build an unsinkable ship, and a home that can survive a tornado. You will also make lava slime.

Kidnapped! The Case of Jason Worth: (Grades 4-8)

A missing heir. Money, power, and mystery. What happened to Jason Worth? You will analyze blood, fibers, handwriting, and fingerprints as you work to solve this engaging "who done it?" This class presents a compelling scenario that relates biology, chemistry, and physics; tied together will all of the intrigue and excitement of an actual criminal case.

K-Nex Engineering: (Grades 4-8)

Use K-Nex and snap circuits to understand topics in science and engineering. Design and build cars in order to learn concepts such as speed, acceleration and understand friction. Design and build bridges in order to test strength. Use snap circuits to make buzzers buzz, lights light and propellers whirl. You will learn to read basic schematics and troubleshoot circuits. This class is exciting and all hands-on.



Knights, Kings, Jesters, and Castles: (Grades 4-8)

Who hasn't wanted to live in a castle and be a brave knight like *King Arthur*? Discover more about the Middle Ages in this minicamp. Learn how to speak like you're from the 15th century, how to sword fight the knight way, get a job at the castle, make a huge 3D castle with your classmates, and perform and create a medieval skit with everyone worthy of a traveling fair, and more.

Let's Go Outside: (Grades 2-3)



Percy Jackson's Greek Explosion Camp: (Grades 4-8) \$70



Razzle Dazzle Disney: (Grades 2-3)

90 years ago, Walt Disney and Mickey Mouse entered the world and filled it with magic! If you believe in fairy godmothers, fly with Peter Pan and Tink, roar with Simba, or belt out "Let it Go" with Elsa, this class is for you! Learn sharing, cooking and manners through games, activities and crafts, all with enchanting Disney magic. This class is a dream come true.

Samurais, Ninjas, and Sushi: (Grades 4-8)

Konnichiwa! Take a trip to Japan without leaving Missouri, the land of the samurais, ninjas, and sushi, and creators of Pokemon, Yu-Gi-Oh, Dragonball, Sailor Moon, and more epicness. Learn basic Japanese words and culture through cool activities from using chopsticks to candy sushi, from watching anime to origami. See real items from Japan. Made for beginners. Sayonara Minna.

Science Rocks: (Grades 2-3)

Do you want to build boats made of foil? How about make magnetic slime? Science Rocks is for you. We will test our foil boats, experiment with magnetic slime, make baskets for an egg drop experiment and build structures with only three materials. Science and engineering fun.

Science Saves Lives: (Grades 2-3)

Take a fantastic journey to discover the underlying science in the world of weather. Learn how clouds make rain, how tornadoes form and what causes a thunderstorm. We will make our own rain clouds using shaving cream, create a tornado in a jar and demonstrate a thunderstorm using hot and cold water.

Sew Much Fun: (Grades 2-3 and 4-8)

Want to learn sewing basics? This is the class for you. Learn everything about how to get started sewing by hand, and make fun and exciting crafts in the process.

Spaceship CFK: (Grades 4-8)

In this crash course on astronomy, the classroom will become our spaceship to explore our solar system and beyond. Make a rocket, test "Martian" soil for life, and see all constellations while indoors. You might even get a chance to talk to extraterrestrials before you return to earth.

Spectacular Snacks: (Grades 2-3)

Snacking doesn't have to be bad for you. Do you want delicious and easy to make snack ideas that are good for you? Then you want to take Spectacular Snacks during CFK. Make your own trail mix, penguin bananas and much, much more.

STEM Kids: (Grades 2-3)

Thomas Edison said, "To invent, you need a good imagination and a pile of junk." In this class, you will use your hands and your imagination and to build exciting new structures using everyday items or recycled materials.

Summer Magic: (Grades 2-3)

Would you like to make S'mores over an indoor campfire. We will do it in Summer Magic. We will also make healthy snacks that do not spoil in the summer heat, learn about fire safety, paint summer fruits and vegetables and create our own mini airplanes and cars to whisk us away for vacation.

The Mystery of the Disappearing Diamonds: (Grades 4-8)

What happened to all of those diamonds? It's up to you to figure out which of the four suspects is responsible for stealing the diamonds from the jewelry store. Experiments include dusting for fingerprints, fingerprint analysis, chromatography and ink analysis, blood type analysis (simulated sample), and fiber analysis using a flame test. Do you have what it takes to solve this case?

**The Science of Fairy Tales:** (Grades 2-3)

Do you love reading classic fairy tales? Then you will love conducting science experiments based on your favorites. Grow "magic" beans in a bag, build a slide for Rapunzel to escape from the tower, build a stronger bed for baby bear after Goldilocks has destroyed his and much, much more.

The Vikings: Nomadic Norsemen: (Grades 4-8)

Become a Viking! Eat, dress, and live as history's favorite barbarians. Play Nordic board games and music, dress and act like Viking warriors, and learn about the real Thor and Loki. Explore the land of ice and snow without ever getting cold. Viking raids not included.

Uke It Up: (Grades 4-8)

Have you ever wanted to learn to play an instrument. Learn the basics of playing the ukelele. You may bring your own ukulele or borrow one. Learn to form the most useful chords, strum and sing. We will play as an ensemble and learn a lot of the popular songs that you love. Come make beautiful music.

**Under the Sea:** (Grades 2-3)

Make your own ocean in a mason jar, sea creatures and all. Together, we will investigate the oceans and many of the sea creatures that live within it, especially sharks. We will make ocean slime and snack on interesting foods.

Unsinkable Titanic: (Grades 2-3 and Grades 4-8)

Travel back in time to explore one of the greatest tragedies of its time, the sinking of The Titanic. Through the luck of the draw, you'll become one of the passengers on the ship. After learning your character, you'll get to know your fellow passengers and begin to understand the social class system that was prevalent then. We'll reconstruct the moments before and after the ship sank and see if we can re-engineer it to survive the hit.

Wiz Kid Technology: (Grades 2-3 and 4-8)

Are you interested in creating a website? Wiz Kid Technology will introduce HTML and CSS in order to build pages and create your own simple static website. Let your inner tech geek out. Let's create something awesome!

Writer's Workshop: (Grades 7-9)

Learn from a real writer, Morgan Straughan Cornick-author of *Spirit Vision*, what it's like behind-the-scenes as an author, and what it takes to get published. In this class, you'll explore different writing styles and famous writers while you create your own projects and stories. Using Mrs. Morgan's book and your imagination, you'll find writing a snap. "Hold on to 'what if'..."

Yarning For Fun: (Grades 4-8)

Learn how to knit or crochet in only five days! You can make your own scarves, hats, small toys, and even covers for phones or tablets. You'll learn basic stitches along with important knitting or crocheting techniques, and you'll go home with a one-of-a-kind craft.
