Updates on Upward Bound Meetings and Saturday Programs

In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, Upward Bound has temporarily changed how we provide services to our students. At most of our schools, we will continue to meet with students in-person. However, some of our schools would prefer we not hold in-person meetings at this time. We also have students attending school virtually this year. In spite of all the changes and potential barriers, Upward Bound continues to serve all students in our program.

In addition to our in-person meetings, Upward Bound now offers 6 different options for virtual meetings throughout the week. Three of the six meetings are during the day and the other three are late afternoon/evening meetings. The virtual meetings not only offer options for virtual learners, but also for students who may have to miss an in-person meeting due to a scheduling conflict or illness. All Zoom links for virtual meetings can be found on the Upward Bound Google Classroom for the academic year. All students were invited to join this classroom.

Students are required to attend at least one meeting per week. This could be an in-person or virtual meeting. Enclosed, you will find a listing of all virtual and in-person meetings. In-person meetings are strictly for students from those designated schools and only for students who are attending school in-person. A Federally Funded Program

The Mineral Area College Upward Bound I program is a TRIO program funded with a five-year, \$1,495,566 grant from the U.S. Department of Education. This represents 100% of the program cost. Mineral Area College provides 25% of indirect costs to support the program.

The Mineral Area College Upward Bound II program is a TRIO program funded with a five-year, \$1,298,771 grant from the U.S. Department of Education. This represents 100% of the program cost. Mineral Area College provides a portion of indirect costs to support the program.

Upward Bound is one of five programs established by Congress to help low-income, first-generation students enter college and graduate. These programs are referred to as the TRIO programs.
