Graduates of the Associate of Science in Nursing program are prepared to perform nursing services as a beginning practitioner inclusive of assessing the health status of individuals with more complex health problems; develop, modify and set goals for client care; delegate nursing responsibilities as team leaders; and evaluate and write revisions in the plan of care for clients with preventative and commonly occurring health problems.

Upon successful completion of the program, the graduate is eligible to apply to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN).

Satisfactory achievement on the licensure exam will qualify the program graduate for licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN).

Successful completion of the program, however, does not guarantee eligibility to take the licensure exam or to become licensed.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Be a graduate of an approved high school or the equivalent as determined by appropriate accrediting agencies (i.e. GED and HiSET).
- 2. Have basic computer knowledge as evidenced by a high school or college computer course.
- Accuplacer Next Generation academic test scores with the following minimums:

- Completion of prerequisite courses, equivalent or higher with a grade of C or above, including corequisite, if indicated, with a grade of pass:
 - ENG1330 [ENGL100] English Composition I
 - MAT1240 [MATH120] Quantitative Reasoning*
 - BIO2600 Human Anatomy
 - BIO2620 Human Physiology
 - *MAT1205 Applications of College Math and MAT1230 College Algebra are accepted as equivalent course
- 5. Minimum grade point average (GPA) based on the four (4) prerequisite courses of:
 - 3.0 for the Associate of Nursing Program
- Successful general application and acceptance to Mineral Area College.
- Evidence of the personal qualifications necessary for a nursing career as determined by Mineral Area College.

Application to the nursing program along with the requirements in this publication must be submitted by noon on March 18, 2024 (deadline) to the Allied Health Department at Mineral Area College.

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APPLICATION PROCESS

The applications for the nursing programs will be accepted August 1, 2023, up until noon March 18, 2024. (deadline)

Assessment testing and prerequisite courses must be completed by the application deadline.

Submit the following documentation by deadline:

- Nursing application
- Application to Mineral Area College
- Accuplacer Next Generation academic test scores
- Official copies of dual credit and transfer transcripts

Selection is based on three (3) criteria:

- GPA calculated from prerequisite courses (50%)
- Assessment test scores (25%)
- Personal interview (25%).

A personal interview with program faculty is required and will be scheduled following the application deadline prior to selection.

All applicants accepted into the program are considered on conditional status pending:

- Submission of required citizenship documentation
- · Passing a drug screen
- Passing a background check
- · Compliance with immunization criteria
- Obtain Basic Life Support (BLS) Certification

Persons who do not meet the above requirements should contact the Director of the Allied Health Department or the Vocational Counselor at Mineral Area College.
