

Important FAFSA Information for Seniors

FAFSA stands for Free Application for Federal Student Aid.

High school seniors need to complete this form to apply for federal student aid such as federal grants, work-study funds, and loans. Completing and submitting the FAFSA form is free. It gives you access to the largest source of aid to help you pay for college.

The earlier you submit your FAFSA, the better. It will boost the amount of state financial aid you may earn. State financial aid is given on a first-come, first-serve basis!

The FAFSA usually opens on October 1st; however, major changes and improvements are coming to the 2024 - 2025 FAFSA form. As a result, the new form will not be available until December 2023.

If you are interested in being a STEP Student next summer, you must complete the 2023 - 2024 AND 2024 - 2025 FAFSA.


- September 16th Marching Band Competetion results: Central 1st place, Fredericktown 3rd place, Potosi 3rd place, North County 4th place.

A Federally Funded Program

The Mineral Area College TRiO Upward Bound 1 program is funded with a five-year, \$359,828 per year grant from the U.S. Department of Education. This represents 100% of the program cost. Mineral Area College provides 25% of indirect costs to support the program.

The Mineral Area College Upward Bound 2 program is a TRIO program funded with a five-year, \$312,480 per year grant from the U.S. Department of Education. This represents 100% of the program cost. Mineral Area College provides a portion of indirect costs to support the program.

Upward Bound is one of five programs established by Congress to help low-income, first-generation students enter college and graduate. These programs are referred to as the TRIO programs.
