GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR THE AAT DEGREE

- 1. Complete all program applications, maintain a minimum institutional and cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher with no grade less than a "B" in all education coursework and content areas and no grade less than a "C" in all other courses, undergo a background screening, and have a clear record prior to being admitted to the program and participating in field experience (See detailed background check policy).
- 2. An Application for Graduation form must be filed with the Registrar's Office by the end of the second week of the fall and spring semesters, and by the end of the first week of the summer semester. Contact navigator for assistance.
- 3. All applicants are required to complete 60 approved semester hours PLUS 2 hours of PE activity course(s) or a CIS course.
- 4. Fifteen (15) hours of Mineral Area College credit must be included in the degree.
- 5. All degree-applicable courses, including electives, must be at a 1000 level or higher.
- 6. Take no more than six elective credits by participating in ensembles.
