

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (LPN TO RN Bridge)

for 2026-2027 Program

THE COLLEGE

Graduates of the Associate of Science in Nursing program are prepared to perform nursing services as a beginning practitioner inclusive of assessing the health status of individuals with more complex health problems; develop, modify and set goals for client care; delegate nursing responsibilities as team leaders; and evaluate and write revisions in the plan of care for clients with preventative and commonly occurring health problems.

Upon successful completion of the program, the graduate should be eligible to apply to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN).

Successful completion of the program, however, does not guarantee eligibility to take the licensure exam or to become licensed.

Satisfactory achievement on the licensure exam will qualify the program graduate for licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN).

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

1a. Be a graduate of an approved program in Practical Nursing and successfully pass the NCLEX-PN licensure exam on the first attempt within 90 days of graduation.
Without successfully passing the NCLEX-PN, students will take all credit hours and clinicals in Medical-Surgical I and II.

OR

- 1b. Have a current Missouri license in Practical Nursing.
2. Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) test score with the following minimum:

3. Completion of prerequisite courses, *equivalent or higher* with a grade of C or above, including co-requisite, if indicated, with a grade of pass:

- ENG1330 [ENGL100] English Composition I
- MAT1240 [MATH120] Quantitative Reasoning*
- BIO2600 Human Anatomy
- BIO2620 Human Physiology
- NUR1290 Fundamentals of Nursing^

**MAT1205 Applications of College Math and MAT1230 College Algebra are accepted as equivalent courses.*

^Fundamentals of Nursing or equivalent courses are accepted.

Prerequisite courses must be in progress or complete by application deadline.

4. Minimum grade point average (GPA) based on the five (5) prerequisite courses of:

- 2.5 for the Associate of Nursing Program

5. Successful general application and acceptance to Mineral Area College prior to nursing application deadline.

6. Completion of a Dosage Calculation and Medication Practicum Exam with a passing grade (will receive date once selection is made).

Application to the nursing program along with the requirements in this publication must be submitted by 3pm on March 6, 2026 (deadline) to the Allied Health Department at Mineral Area College.

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APPLICATION PROCESS

Nursing applications will be accepted from September 1, 2025 until 3pm on March 6, 2026. (deadline).

TEAS test and prerequisite courses must be completed by the application deadline.

Submit the following documentation by deadline:

- Nursing application
- Application to Mineral Area College
- TEAS composite test score proficient or higher
- Official copies of dual credit and transfer transcripts

Selection is based on three (3) criteria:

- GPA calculated from prerequisite courses (40%)
- TEAS composite test score (40%)
- Personal interview (20%)

A personal interview with program faculty is required and will be scheduled following the application deadline prior to selection.

All applicants accepted into the program are considered on conditional status pending:

- Submission of required citizenship documentation
- Passing a drug screen
- Passing a background check
- Compliance with immunization criteria
- Obtain Basic Life Support (BLS) Certification
(student must maintain current BLS for the length of program)

1a. Applicants to the Advanced Placement program must be a graduate of an approved program in Practical Nursing and have successfully passed the NCLEX-PN licensure exam on the first attempt within 90 days of graduation.

Without successfully passing the NCLEX-PN, students will take all credit hours and clinicals in Medical-Surgical I and II.

OR

1b. Have a current Missouri license in Practical Nursing.

Persons who do not meet the above requirements should contact the Director of the Allied Health Department at Mineral Area College.
