THE COLLEGE

Graduates are prepared to perform services, inclusive of assessing the health status of individuals; participate in the development, modification, and evaluation of client care; provide care in acute and chronic care settings, rehabilitation facilities, and health care settings promoting preventative care; direct bedside care and serve as client advocates.

Upon successful completion of the program, the graduate should be eligible to apply to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Practical Nurses (NCLEX-PN).

Successful completion of the program, however, does not guarantee eligibility to take the licensure exam or to become licensed.

Satisfactory achievement on the licensure exam will qualify the program graduate for licensure as a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN).

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

1. Be a graduate of an approved high school or the equivalent as determined by appropriate accrediting agencies (i.e., GED and HiSET).
2. Have basic computer knowledge as evidenced by a high school or college computer course.
3. Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) test score with the following minimum:

Proficient	58.7

4. Completion of the following courses, with a grade of C or above. Completed courses used for GPA selection:
 - ENG1330 [ENGL100] English Composition I
 - MAT1240 [MATH120] Quantitative Reasoning*
 - BIO2600 Human Anatomy^
 - BIO2620 Human Physiology^**

(**Required for those seeking Advanced Placement (AP)
(See AP brochure)

Prerequisite courses must be completed by MAC's commencement in the spring semester of the application year.

5. Minimum grade point average (GPA) for prerequisite courses:
 - 2.5 for Program in Practical Nursing.
6. Successful general application and acceptance to Mineral Area College before the nursing application deadline.
7. Applicants on the AP track (successful completion of Human Physiology) will be given priority during the selection process.

Nursing applications to the nursing program, along with the requirements in this publication, must be submitted by 3 pm on March 8, 2027 (deadline) to the Allied Health Department at Mineral Area College.

APPLICATION PROCESS

- 1) Apply to MAC and be accepted
- 2) Complete nursing application. Applications accepted from 08/24/26 until 3 pm on 03/08/2027
- 3) Request that official copies of dual credit and transfer transcripts be sent to MAC
- 4) Achieve a TEAS composite test score of proficient or higher

TEAS test must be completed by MAC's spring commencement of the application year and must be no older than 2 years from this date.

^^ Selection is based on two (2) criteria:

- GPA calculated from prerequisite courses
- TEAS composite test score

All applicants accepted into the program are considered on conditional status pending:

- Submission of required citizenship documentation
- Passing a drug screen
- Passing a background check
- Compliance with immunization criteria
- Obtain Basic Life Support (BLS) Certification (certified within the program)

Persons who do not meet the above requirements should contact the Director of the Allied Health Department at Mineral Area College.
